Course Objectives:

In this course, we will start with a brief overview of orofacial pain. Trigeminal neuropathies secondary to common dental procedures such as endodontic treatment and implant surgery, its pathogenesis and management will be covered.

2. Learn early and late management of trigeminal neuropathy.
3. Learn preventive measures to prevent complications while performing dental treatment.
